Small Grants Round - Applicant Criteria

- 1. Applicants must be a registered charity, a not-for-profit social enterprise or a community interest company working within the UK, with a UK office.
- 2. Social enterprise and community interest companies must have a governing document which shows their name, aim/purpose, objects of the group, including a dissolution clause what happens if your group ceases to function.

This clause should show that you are a not-for-profit group by confirming that any assets remaining after all debts are paid will be given to another voluntary group with similar aims.

This document should also include details of your Trustees/Directors or Management Committee.

- 3. The applying organisation must be for women and girls and be led by women.
- 4. The **organisation's beneficiaries** must be 100% young women and girls.
- 5. The **maximum annual income** to apply for this funding is £50,000 for your last financial year.
- 6. The project beneficiaries must be aged between 11 and 30.
- 7. Applicants must demonstrate in their application how they have expertise and a history of working with young women and girls caught up in the criminal justice system.
- 8. We are keen to see applications that support young women and girls who are care-experienced, neurodiverse, outside education or close to exclusion, have known involvement in gangs or county lines or are from Black or minoritised/racialised communities. These are by no means exclusive, but examples of the kind of work we expect to support based on previous applications for funding.
- 9. Funding of £10,000 will be awarded to successful applicants.
- 10. The funding must be spent within a specified time frame of no more than 12 months.
- 11. If you have previously made an unsuccessful application, twelve months or more from the submission date must have elapsed before reapplying.
- 12. Applicants must have their annual accounts independently examined or audited.
